The recipient of this scholarship must meet the following criteria:

Student must be accepted and intend to enroll in a program that will enable the student to become a teacher upon graduation from college.

Student **must attach proof of acceptance** in an accredited program with his/her application.

Students involved in FTA will receive **first priority**.

Student should demonstrate evidence of concern for others, good character and participation in school activities.

Academic records and social interaction in the community will also be used to select recipients of this scholarship.

Please print clearly in blue or black ink **or** type on a computer.

The scholarship will be presented at graduation ceremonies. One half of the scholarship will be given at the end of the first semester of college, and the remaining half will be given at the end of the second semester.

If it is found that none of the applicants meet the above criteria, the committee reserves the option to not award the scholarship.

When applying to this scholarship, you are automatically eligible for the North Collins Teacher's Association scholarship for \$200. To avoid duplication, if you complete the Marilyn Bauerlein Memorial Scholarship there is no need to fill out an application for the North Collins Teacher's Association Scholarship.
